COVID-19 UPDATE: Masses have resumed as shown, in line with current COVID-19 restrictions. **ONLY 72 PEOPLE ARE ABLE TO ATTEND MASS AT ANY ONE TIME AT ST PATRICKS.** It is preferable for you to register with the Parish Office. **PLEASE EMAIL THE PARISH AND LEAVE YOUR NAME, TELEPHONE NUMBER, EMAIL ADDRESS AND PREFERENCE TIME FOR MASS ATTENDANCE** (Saturday evening or Sunday). **The parish phone is not always attended so please only call if you do not have email.** If you do not register you may still attend mass, however you **MUST leave your name and contact details on the sheet upon entering** and can only enter if less than 72 people have registered on the entry sheet already.

Your health and welfare are our top concern. **Any person who is unwell, any person with co-morbidities (e.g. compromised immune or respiratory systems), and those over 70 years of age should exercise particular caution. For some it may be more appropriate to attend a weekday Mass when there are less people present or to receive pastoral care from clergy in their home. Before and After Mass you are asked to minimise any time spent together and avoid large group gathering Before and After Mass. No group singing is permitted.
